Biosketch

Paul A. Lombardo is a Professor of Law at Georgia State University College of Law. As a member of the core faculty at the Center for Law, Health and Society, he teaches courses in Genetics and the Law, the History of Bioethics, Mental Health Law and the Legal Regulation of Human Research. He has published extensively on topics in health law, medico-legal history, and bioethics. He is coeditor of *Fletcher's Clinical Ethics*, (3rd ed.) and recently published *Three Generations, No Imbeciles: Eugenics, the Supreme Court and Buck v. Bell* (Johns Hopkins University Press, 2008).

From 1990 until 2006 Dr. Lombardo served on the faculty of the Schools of Law and Medicine at the University of Virginia, where he was the Director of the Center for Mental Health Law at the Institute of Law, Psychiatry and Public Policy, then the Director of the Program in Law and Medicine in the Center for Biomedical Ethics.

Dr. Lombardo holds a B.A. from Rockhurst College, an M.A. from Loyola University in Chicago, Illinois and both the Ph.D. and J.D. degrees from the University of Virginia.
